5.0 Election of Board Members

Board Role Overview:

The President:

- supervises the affairs of the Board,
- when present, chairs all meetings of the Society, and the Board;
- is an ex officio member of all Committees, except the Nominating Committee;
- acts as the spokesperson for the Society; and
- carries out other duties as assigned by the Board

The Vice-President:

- presides at meetings in the President's absence. If the Vice-President is absent, the Board Members elect a Chairperson for the meeting.
- replaces the President at various functions when asked to do so by the President or the Board;
- chairs the Personnel Committee; and
- carries out other duties as assigned by the Board.

The Secretary:

- attends all meetings of the Society and the Board
- keeps accurate minutes of these meetings
- makes sure a record of names and addresses of all Members of the Society is kept
- carries out other duties as assigned by the Board.
- Keeps and carries the seal of the society

The Treasurer:

- makes sure all monies paid to the Society are deposited in a chartered bank, treasury branch or trust company chosen by the Board;
- makes sure annual fees are collected and deposited;
- makes sure a detailed account of revenues and expenditures is presented to the Board as requested;
- makes sure an audited statement of the financial position of the Society is prepared and presented to the Annual General Meeting;
- chairs the Finance Committee of the Board
- ensures the filling of: the annual return, changes in the Board Members of the organization, amendments in the bylaws and other incorporating documents with the Corporate Registry and other government returns as required
- carries out other duties as assigned by the Board.

Education Director

- Chairs the Education Committee
- Supports the education of new instructors
- Organizes opportunities for instructor professional development.

Safety & Touring Director

- Chairs the Safety Committee
- monitors and advises the Board on all matters of paddling safety brought before the Board.
- Monitors and advises the Board on all matters related to the provision of paddling touring information for Alberta through the Society's communication program.

Environment Director

- Chairs the Environmental Committee
- Advises the Board on all matters of environmental concern brought before the Board.
- Promotes environmental stewardship within the paddling community.

Instructor Representative

- Communicates concerns, questions, and comments between instructors and the Paddle Alberta Board.
- Represents all Canoe, SUP, Recreational and Sea Kayak instructors in the province.

Paddle Canada Regional Representative

• Liaises between Paddle Alberta and Paddle Canada on all educational and regional member association matters.

Member at Large

• Carries out duties and responsibilities as assigned by the board.
